

Postsecondary Training Options: Wilson Workforce and Rehabilitation Center

Virginia's Wilson Workforce and Rehabilitation Center (WWRC) provides comprehensive, individualized services to prepare people with disabilities for pathways to employment and independence. Many of these services are provided while clients live on the WWRC campus.

Services for adult clients include:

- **Vocational training:** workforce-training, education, and other supports that result in industry-recognized credentials in career pathways and competitive employment
- **Vocational evaluation assessment:** processes in which a client obtains greater self and work knowledge through participation in work activities designed to evaluate vocational skills, interests, and abilities
- **Rehabilitation counseling:** guidance on ways to achieve goals and demonstrate self-advocacy skills

General Entry Requirements

Age: Must be 18 years of age or older to be admitted for residential services.

Physical requirements: Must be medically, physically and psychologically stable. Current behavior cannot jeopardize the health, safety or rehabilitation program of self or others.

Educational requirement: WWRC accepts applications of any Virginia Department for Aging and Rehabilitation Services consumer with a disability whose needs are compatible with the structure, staff, and other WWRC resources.

Typical Duration

Vocational training & rehabilitation counseling: Varies according to program but ranges from 2 weeks to 12 months.

Vocational evaluation assessment: One-half day to four consecutive days based on specific evaluations.
